The gala dinner commenced at 18:30 pm at Robbinsdale United Church of Christ of Nelson Mandela Metropolitan Municipality overlooking the scenic Lovemore mountains. Over 100 entrepreneurs honoured the evening to witness the ultra-performers business and leadership gala.



Robbinsdale United Church of Christ, Pastor Lindelwa Jadezweni provided the opening remarks and welcomed guests in the event.

"Today we are here to honour local entrepreneurs who are making a change in the society".

"If you educate a man, you educate one individual, but if you educate a woman, you educate a nation. These are the words of Ghanaian idiom which are applicable in this juncture as we celebrate hard working entrepreneurs and women of South Africa this evening," said Jadezweni.

Pastor Lingelihle Jadezweni further provided motivational words to all aspiring entrepreneurs who had come to witness and listen to local entrepreneurs as they narrated their stories to the world.

He mentioned that "sefa is an implementing agency of the Department of Small Business Development and it was founded in 2012 following the merge of three agencies Khula, Apex Fund and IDC small business funding.

"Tonight, we are here to bestow honour to the current crop of economic fighters, who are emulating those of 1956, but these are fighting in the business terrain, removing barriers and trading in traditionally male dominated terrains like construction, logistics and mining," he added.

Mr Motse Mfuleni, Board Chairperson of the Mandela Bay Development Agency called on financial institutions to desist from old age practices of backing only male owned businesses and back female owned enterprises.

"Women businesses have to be backed up so that they can grow and nowadays women owned businesses are doing well more than those owned by men in every aspect of businesses," he said.

Group CEO at African Pioneer, Mr Stephen Dondolo thanked the Robbinsdale United Church of Christ founders for hosting the ultra-performers in business and leadership gala which seeks to uplift and appreciate local entrepreneurs.

Minister Ndabeni-Abrahams took the stage with a thunderous applause from the packed banqueting hall. In her keynote address she said "It is imperative that the small business sector is empowered to disrupt existing industries in a positive way, by creatively contributing in a way that creates new businesses through technology and innovation."

She further said that "One of our primary goals is to link SMMEs and Co-operatives to markets all over the globe, particularly in Africa, Asia, Europe, North and South America, and to everywhere else to ensure that they find a market."

"One of our important aims is to advance gender equality and promote economic inclusion through targeted support to women entrepreneurs in international and regional trade,"

Minister Ndabeni-Abrahams emphasised that the Department for Small Business Development (DSBD) and the Small Enterprise Development Agency (Seda), the ITC SheTrades set up a Hub in South Africa, in order to help South African women entrepreneurs, increase their international competitiveness and connect to national, regional and global markets through the SheTradesZA Hub. "Through the SheTrades ZA Hub, women-owned businesses can connect to potential buyers, investors, suppliers and business support organizations, learn skills to boost business potential through free e-learning courses, on-site workshops and webinars; they can receive support to attend national, regional and international trade fairs and also gain access to investment opportunities," she concluded.
